Pastors wear stoles to symbolize the shepherd's hook of Christ. We also wear them because they symbolize how we are called to carry the wounds of our community. As I think about the symbolism behind stoles, I think about all of the difficulties that our congregation has faced this year. We have already lost some faithful disciples in this short year. We are also remembering our fellow disciples who are under hospice care at this time. On top of that, individually, many of us are struggling. Communally, we are wrestling with numerous wars in our world and politicians who - to quote the artist formerly known as Prince - need to "act their age, not their shoe size."

I share these words not to solely lament with you, but to come alongside you to encourage you to take care of yourself during these times. As a reminder, we are human beings, not human doings. Instead of focusing on all that there is to do, what if you could focus on being present? Do you need to have an extra hour of sleep one night this week? Do you need to go for a walk? Do you need to disengage for a moment so that you can be better en-

gaged in the needs of our community and world?

We can be tempted to go faster, harder, and longer during such seasons. As we reflect upon the way of Jesus, we can see the moments when He took time to be alone with God in prayer. He modeled what it looked like to acknowledge that He could not do it all, so He had to go to others to ask for help (Mark 6:5ff). If Jesus was aware that He could not do it all, what if you did too?

Jesus said it best - "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew. 11:29). May it be so!

When Bob Bock preached a sermon titled, "The Strength of A Cable" on the first Sunday in January 1970, he had no idea that it would resonate loudly enough to be preached annually for 51 years.

He loved starting off his stories with the science of it: The principle of synergy says that a single strand of wire wrapped around another single strand multiplies its strength, not twice, but 20 times. Heavy cables begin with seven small wires wrapped around each other, then another seven, and so on until the desired strength and size is achieved. Sometimes, he punctuated the lesson by wrapping his big hand around and holding up a thick piece of cable like the ones that keep the San Francisco Bay Bridge safely in the air.

To Bob, however, the cable strand was only an object lesson illustrating a more important human one: By ourselves, we are often limited or even defeated by our own frailties and other constraints. When we come together and dedicate ourselves to working as one on something that is only a dream, our quantified strength can bring it to reality. Faith, resolve and common direction can literally change our world. Our church has a hundred years' worth of stories that prove the point.

The moments when we came down the side aisle toward the Chancel area to leave our offerings, partake of Communion, then receive our cable strands from him were often the most personal, connective time in the service. Widening the reach of synergism, many of us asked for extra strands to take or send to others.

We gathered to celebrate our 51st Strength of the Cable Sunday on January 12, 2020, just two months before COVID shut down so much in our lives. Bob had hoped we could gather in the Sanctuary for Cable Sunday once again in the spring of 2021, but his illness overtook him. He left us that year on Good Friday, April 2nd.

Now, all of us are the storytellers. We are the ones to continue sharing the lessons in the Cable Sunday stories, as well as those of countless others who have made this church what it was and what it is. At the same time, we are living and sharing in the life stories that may well be what the First Christian Church of North Hollywood will be in the future.


