





APPLY TO BE A 2024 PEACE INTERN APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY JANUARY 31!

Each year Disciples Peace Fellow selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid internship (\$3,000 summer stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and justice in many different ways and in several different formats. The 2024 DPF Peace Internship will

be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at in-person Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners (like the Fellowship of Reconciliation, the InterReligious Task Force on Central America, and Blessed Tomorrow). The designers of our Social Hall couldn't have imagined all the different occasions that would take place there. Countless dinners, receptions, and meetings are only some of them. There, we have made new friends and shared with cherished old ones.

Early on, Sunday School children watched movies and filmstrips based on Bible stories, then spread around the room in classes separated by wooden partitions. More recently, it has been a theatre, art and photo gallery, and Vacation Bible School during our summer camps.

Soon after moving, the church invited the community to a church-warming dinner, complete with entertainment. Wednesday night potluck dinners quickly became popular. In the spacious kitchen, a professional-size stove was a far cry from the tiny one at the old church. There, the stove door was wired shut to keep it from falling off.

George Crosby, our Congregational President (1979-81) saw the value in sharing conversation and lives together over food. He briefly persuaded some of our best cooks to make full breakfasts "just for free fun and fellowship" after church. People came in droves. George learned about the labor involved when he personally made "thousands of biscuits from scratch." Still, his vision of sharing conversation and food after church may have been the seed that grew into our present Meet and Greets.

Some of our oldsters used the room's wooden floor for square-dancing. Teenagers loved it as a basketball court until the thudding rearranged loose items in the CNS/Sunday School rooms downstairs. A TV star even practiced rollerskating on it for an upcoming episode.

Famously, the stage hosted a tenth-anniversary production of "Godspell," with many from the original Broadway cast. So began our Advent Theatre which was covered in an earlier story. For years, our youngest and oldest members have entertained us in a variety of productions.

Diverging, perhaps, from the dreamers' original vision, our Sunday night Praise Service rocked the place before COVID. Its different worship style made religious observances more approachable to many people.

The Social Hall has widened the perspectives of our Sanctuary congregants as well. Few could have imagined morning worship upstairs instead of downstairs – especially for any length of time. For much of 1989, however, we gathered upstairs while the Sanctuary underwent extensive renovations. Five years later, the Northridge earthquake seriously damaged the room. Gathering in the Social Hall during the months that followed reminded us all of a valuable lesson: that "sanctuary" is a feeling as well as a place.




