

APPLY TO BE A 2024 PEACE INTERN

APPLICATIONS DUE BY JANUARY 31!

Each year Disciples Peace Fellow selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid internship (\$3,000 summer stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and justice in many different ways and in several different formats. The 2024 DPF Peace Internship will be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at in-person Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners (like the Fellowship of Reconciliation, the InterReligious Task Force on Central America, and Bless-

Back in the mid-2000's, one of our members experienced an unexpected upheaval in his professional, financial & personal life. As he struggled with his situation, he began to take long, contemplative walks in North Hollywood Park. There, he became aware of the growing number of unhoused and hungry people and their struggles.

Rob Koffski, who passed away January 1, 2024, put aside his own issues and went back to our church and recruited other members like Karl Klein and the late Judy McCalla. They began what would become the Human Needs Ministry. They first started with sporadic weekday picnics in the park, bringing sandwiches, salads, and desserts. Then they added donations of cold weather gear and toiletries.

In October 2004, the Church Board of Trustees charged the Human Needs Ministry with dealing with the issues of hunger, homelessness and abuse. The committee addressed the congregation at the Meet N' Greet in November 2004, and talked about serving the least among us. Human Needs grew from picnics for 20-30 clients into a monthly 2nd Sunday afternoon feeding of a full hot meal served by more than 20 volunteers to more than 100 needy "neighborhood friends." Added over the years were the serving of Communion, and the distribution of clothing, hygiene kits & toiletries by Shelley Cherwinski and her partner Chris Qualls. Jay Aldrich later took over that responsibility and continues it along with Mary Heiss to this day.

In 2008, Rob moved away and Deborah Luster stepped up to chair this valuable ministry that has continued with many devoted volunteers. On this past Thanksgiving, the Human Needs Committee served 16 turkeys with all the trimmings and 12 hams plus fruit, desserts, sodas & coffee. The clients said it was the best food ever!

Rob's philosophy was that, while indeed, the meals were designed to bring food to the hungry, it was also a time of camaraderie, sharing laughter, friendship and reflections. It was important to treat these folks with respect and dignity.

A memorial service for Rob Koffski will be held in our Social Hall on Saturday, January 20th from 3 to 5 pm. All are welcome.


