Some of you ask me, "How do you decide what to preach?" Of course, I look for a nudge from God through reading commentaries, prayer, learning from my favorite scholars, etc. Additionally, I take time to see what our community needs to experience at this moment. I take this step by reflecting on our conversations, reading through our prayer cards, replaying pastoral care moments, and other similar situations.

Each text has lots of directions, but one of the roles in my vocation is discerning what needs to be experienced right now.

This sort of thing gets me thinking. I wonder how you decide what needs to be done as you are being pulled in 25 different ways. I know that many of us feel that way right now in life, with our careers, within our families, etc. What could help you make this sort of decision (of what the next best step could be)? My hope and prayer is that you can be intentional with this decision. If not, you may feel as if you are getting pulled in 25 different directions!



FINAL WEEK TO APPLY TO BE A PEACE INTERN APPLY BY JANUARY 31!

Each year Disciples Peace Fellow selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid internship (\$3,000 summer stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and justice in many different ways and in several different formats. The 2024 DPF Peace Internship will be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at in-person Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners (like the Fellowship of Reconciliation, the InterReligious Task Force on Central America, and Blessed Tomorrow). 2024 PASTOR'S CLASS

BEGINS WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14[™]

WHAT IS A PASTOR'S CLASS?

Pastor's Class is a 6-week class for youth to connect their story to God's story. The class covers topics such as our local church, our denomination (Christian Church Disciples of Christ), baptism, scripture, and Lent to name a few. The youth will also have the opportunity to come up with a service project of their very own. At the end of the class, the youth will be baptized and recognized for their commitment.

WHEN

Our first class together will be on Ash Wednesday, February 14th, at 5:30pm during the Ash Wednesday service. The remaining classes will be on the following Sundays (after worship):

The last gathering will be a brief meeting prior to baptisms during the 6:00am Easter Worship Service.

WHERE

Sunday classes will be hosted at the church in the Annex. This is the building behind the sanctuary.

MENTORS

A very important part of the class is the selection and presence of a youth mentor for each youth. The mentor is an adult, 23 years or older, who journeys along with your youth. They offer vital support and wisdom each week as the youth learn and engage. This year, we are giving youth participants the opportunity to reach out to an adult in the congregation and choose their mentor. We ask that there only be one mentor to one youth. We also ask that your youth inform us who they chose and confirmed with when the time comes. If you are new to the church and not familiar with the congregation just yet. Pastor Jonathan and I could help you find someone you'd feel comfortable with.

BAPTISM

On Easter Sunday, March 31st at 6:00am, we will baptize all youth participants. Our youth are not only being baptized into the faith, but into this congregation. The mentors, teachers, and pastors will be present. We also invite you to share this with your family and friends who'd like to come.

LUNCHES

Once we identify who the mentors will be, I will reach out to them and figure out a schedule for lunches. It's easier to learn on a full stomach. If you can please inform me on your registration form of your youth's allergies and/or preferences that would be great.

REGISTRATION FORM

You should have received an email with the registration form for Pastor's Class. If you are interested and would like to sign up your youth for this opportunity, please do so soon. You can pick up and fill out a paper copy and submit it to me, or scan the completed form and email it to me. Paper copies will be available at the church entrance. **The deadline to submit forms is Sunday, February 11th**.

ABSENCE OR WITHDRAWAL FROM THE CLASS

If at any point, your youth is going to miss a class, arrive late, leave early, or withdraw, please inform me at least 24 hours in advance. We strongly encourage all participants to attend each full class. Any materials that are missed, makes it difficult to catch up. Please be sure to plan for these classes each week.

Our First Christian Church of North Hollywood Library recently opened an exhibit featuring photographs of our church buildings between 1928 and 2024. They tell the story of our ancestors and their determination to sacrifice, problem solve, and provide the buildings and resources for a growing congregation. In the photo of our first location on Hartsook St., the 1928 Sunday School class is pictured standing out front. The minister, Rev. Roberts, is at the far right.

The glass-enclosed case has photos of our church buildings in chronological order (pictured at right and on the opposite page), along with written captions telling some of the story behind them. Included in this photo documentary is a funny, yet also accurate photo of some of the church ladies hanging out of our Social Hall windows, cleaning them in anticipation of the church opening. That photo appeared in a local valley newspaper.

The magazine bookcase on the other side of the doorway is filled with copies of old newspaper articles that were published in local newspapers during the 1940s and 1950s. Several church ladies had clipped them out and saved them in scrapbooks, which our 100th Anniversary History Committee discovered. The actual clippings are in very fragile condition, but make such worthwhile reading that we cop-



ied and mounted them on black foam board. Please read them in the library, then return them to the bookcase rack for others to enjoy.

As excitement builds over our FCCNH Centennial Celebration, please take a moment to look over these interesting historical displays in our library. – The 100th Anniversary Team


