



APPLY TO BE A 2024 PEACE INTERN APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY JANUARY 31!

Each year Disciples Peace Fellow selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid internship (\$3,000 summer stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and justice in many different ways and in several different formats. The 2024 DPF Peace Internship will

be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at in-person Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners (like the Fellowship of Reconciliation, the InterReligious Task Force on Central America, and Blessed Tomorrow). Happy New Year, church!

Out of the mouths of babes comes great wisdom, and the children mentioned this morning that we make New Year's resolutions. One of the resolutions that I would invite you to make is to join those of us who are tithing members of this church—not everybody is (there's no guilt if you're not)—and consider tithing in 2024 as a resolution. The people who built this church, built this congregation, gave of their wealth, gave of their money, gave of their time, gave of their skills to create what we now have and what we now use. I would invite you to join us.

I happen to be born into a tithing family. My Dad was the church treasurer so he knew who gave how much, and when I got a dollar, 10% (10¢)

went into the offering plate. That's just how I was raised. I found that that's possible to do if I write the tithe check first and everything else falls in order. So, the strike is over, I tithed on a teacher's salary, I tithe now on a pension, and I think now that you could try it, too. Try it at least for the month of January and see how it works. That's the Biblical request.

If it's too difficult for you, again, no guilt in our church at all, but remember the people who built this sanctuary, who built this church. Over the next year we're going to celebrate our 100th anniversary and hear a lot of their stories, the stories of those dedicated people who reached into their pockets and gave.

Consider it next week.





Celebrating One Hundred Years:

SUNDAY SCHOOL IN A CHANGING WORLD

By the close of World War II, the San Fernando Valley was no longer a sleepy farming community. The movie industry, aircraft manufacturing, and smaller businesses were seriously changing both the land-scape and the population. Between 1945 and 1950, the Valley population exploded from about 230,000 in 1945 to 403,000 in 1950. The rapid increase in growing families challenged community institutions like churches and schools to keep up.

On the corner of Moorpark and Bakman, FCCNH struggled to manage its limited space while effectively providing for the spiritual and social needs of a growing membership. The church's 1949 Yearbook listed a total of 558 active members, of whom 164 were new. Adding to the challenges, all facets of the church were necessarily immersed in planning for a March 1950 move to the new, 19,000-square-foot campus half a mile away. Nevertheless, the primary focus had to remain on meeting present needs.

That challenge was especially apparent where children were concerned. FCCNH has always prioritized the young people in our midst. That is the reason why the first buildings added to the Moorpark and Bakman campus were designated for use as Sunday School classrooms. The Superintendent's 1949 Yearbook report lists a "Children's Church enrollment of 566 children in six departments through high school." New enrollments for the year totaled 204. Weekly attendance averaged 244. It took more than 40 teachers, advisors, and assistants to manage a thriving program for young people that included worship, study and fellowship while building awareness of, and outreach toward, the world around them. The junior high (Chi Rho) and high school (CYF) groups also enjoyed midweek and outside activities in addition to social gatherings at private homes. The world was a very different place in 1949. Television, computers, cell phones, and social networks were not yet a ubiquitous, diverting presence in daily life. Stores were often closed on Sunday and there were no weekend sports leagues. Churches like our own more directly filled a need for in-person connections as well as a spiritual presence.

We approach our 100th anniversary facing new challenges of re-entering and re-engaging with a more fragile, fractured, post-COVID world. As with earlier generations, a major part of the solution to those challenges very likely rests in nurturing the minds, energy, and hearts of our young people.




