

What if Advent was the arrival of a person? The easy answer would be Jesus! Yes, of course! Let's go



Celebrating One Hundred Years:

BUILDING ON FAITH

The buildings on Hartsook Street served the church family well from 1925 until early 1941, when roof leaks and termites arrived. After considering repairs, the congregation instead accepted an offer from the Nazarene church to buy the buildings. Unfortunately, the retired Rev. Roberts held trust deeds to the property, so the parishioners received none of the proceeds. Searching instead for a new site, they found a lot just east of Tujunga, near the corner of Moorpark and Bakman.

It was not the first and would not be the last time FCCNH took a leap of faith. With over 100 people on its rolls, but perhaps half that number in active membership, building a new church in wartime was especially challenging. A loan from the Southern California Missionary Society augmented congregational contributions.

Even so, 1942 wartime needs could block building permission. Manpower was often scarce. Materials were difficult to find or subject to restrictions, so the church bought surplus Quonset huts and other small military buildings and moved them onto the property. The June 1942 board minutes discuss starting construction on a building even before having a priority number. The unsigned minutes also end with, "Receiving notice that a radio silence and blackout was on, the meeting was hastily adjourned."

From the beginning, young people have been considered one of our church's greatest assets. For that reason, the Sunday School building was the first one on the new lot. The most helpful gift was the "sweat equity" of skilled carpenters, electricians, painters and other workers in the congregation. Despite severe financial strains, the sanctuary known affectionately as the "Little White Chapel" was completed in time for Palm Sunday 1943, albeit absent proper pews or carpeting.

The same building blocks of faith, determination, and willingness to work that led to chartering FCCNH in the first place and were nurtured on Hartsook and in the Little White Chapel became the foundation of the big red brick church standing today on the corner of Moorpark and Colfax.


