

# Telebrating One Hundred Years



# Offertory Meditation

In an autonomous congregation such as ours, it's important for each of us, as members, to be aware of what's happening here. If you're not currently receiving our weekly Newsletter online or by snail mail, please call the church office and start reading it. Every week, we publish the weekly giving toward the back of the Newsletter, and those of us who read it are concerned that our current giving is lower than our budgetary needs of about \$11,000 per week.


