

"It is real!" I shared these words after the Children's Pageant on Sunday as part of the benediction. The original reference was to how the baby Jesus during the Children's Pageant was Quentin Hickey. The point was that the story is real. My hope and prayer was that we know and experience the "realness" of the birth of Jesus.

I closed the benediction by sharing the possibility that we can make the story of Christmas real for others. I can think of the people who made the story real for me. Can you think of those people?

For example, I saw one of my youth group sponsors when I went back to Alabama for Thanksgiving. I thanked her for having a profound impact on my life. She was surprised by my words and played off her importance. Then, I took the opportunity to explain the impact that she had on me and my life trajectory. I may have felt called to ministry, but her presence and love helped me to better hear the call. If I felt estranged from church while experiencing the call, I may not have listened.

The impact that we have on others is incredibly profound. You may be surprised by who you have impacted. You might try to play off your importance, but you made it happen. Perhaps it was behind the scenes by filling up the communion cups or it may have been by sending a birthday card.

Through the effort of our 100th Anniversary Cel-

ebration Team, I am reminded that we are blessed by those who have gone before us. They have ensured that our church was upright and standing. They made the phone calls to raise the down payment to make the move to this location. They made the follow-up phone calls when the first round of money was not enough. Some of them built the Youth Hut. Others counted the offering each week. Still others served as presidents, board members, and much more!

The story that we tell - the greatest story ever told (the Gospel) - is made real for us and for those who come after us because of our effort and our willingness to support the ministries of our church.

As was shared previously, we were \$90k (and, at some points during the year, more than \$100k) in the red for the year. This was due - in large part - to the strikes affecting numerous families in our church and the part of our budget where we anticipate facility use income from film shoots. Additionally, our utility bills have been higher than expected as the rates have increased. Thanks to your dedication and gifts, we are now only \$81k in the red for the year.

I am writing to ask that you join me and my family in making an additional gift to the church this December.

- We will do it for ourselves because of how this church blesses us.
- We will do it for others because we know the impact that this church has on our community and world.
- We will do it to honor those who "paid it forward" for us to be able to experience the gospel.
- We will do it because "it is real."
- We will do it because we want our neighbors to experience the "realness" of the Gospel.

APPLY TO BE A 2024 **PEACE INTERN!** APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY JANUARY 31!

Each year Disciples Peace Fellow selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid internship (\$3,000 summer stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and

justice in many different ways and in several different formats. The 2024 DPF Peace Internship will be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at in-person Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners (like the Fellowship of Reconciliation, the InterReligious Task Force on Central America, and Blessed Tomorrow). Part of my duties on Sunday mornings is preparing the communion trays. The current trays I believe have been used for the last 20 years. In the deacon room to the left as you approach the library, another set of trays sit rather ceremoniously. These trays were the ones used for many years prior. They serve as a reminder of all that shared communion at First Christian Church of North Hollywood over the years. The trays sit on the top shelf and I sense they have spiritual power. For years I thought they were donated by Ethel Bruce, Janet's mother. A few months ago, I mentioned to Janet that I keep the trays her mother donated clean. She told me they weren't donated by her mother; they were donated by Evelyn Briggs. Evelyn and Carvel Briggs were longtime members of

the church. Evelyn was church secretary from 1955 to sometime in the 1970's. Every couple of months I will clean those trays in remembrance of those who have faithfully provided service to our church.

Looking at those trays each Sunday I find my mind wondering how many times those trays have been served to the congregation with mixed feelings in their hearts. In times of joy such as today with the Children's pageant. In times of immense sadness, we pray for those with heavy hearts.

Part of the beauty of First Christian Church of North Hollywood is that Holy Communion is served each Sunday. We share communion; at that moment we share our faith. Our lives forever touch. All are welcome.

Celebrating One Hundred Mears:

CHRISTMAS TREE LOTS PAST AND PRESENT

At the December 1, 1948 FCCNH Board Meeting (while the church was still at the corner of Moorpark and Bakman), there appeared a small item under New Business: "The Boy Scouts would like to raise funds by selling Christmas trees at church, providing they [have] approval to (a) use the adjoining lot, (b) to be underwritten by the church for \$100, (c) to have sleeping quarters in the Church school." After some discussion, the request was passed by an apparently unanimous vote. Whether the venture was a success or failure is not known.

Thirty-four years later, in 1982, David Haskell appeared before the Church board with a dream that FCCNH would sponsor a Christmas tree lot, with most profits going to support children's charities. The board minutes for that year have not yet been unearthed in The Great 100th Anniversary FCCNH History Search. A brief, tantalizing mention does appear in Tommy Tomlinson's 1984 update to Dorothy Hall's 1964 church history: "Other notable events in 1982," he said, included "the organization of the first annual church Christmas Tree lot by David Haskell, which turned out to be a major source of funds for our outreach program."


Forty-one years later, in 2023, the FCCNH tree lot continues, and has even added to its original children's charities. As we emerge from our COVID-defined lives, however, our church's historically important programs are challenged in very fundamental ways. It takes many hands, feet, strong backs, good minds, and even stronger hearts to turn dreams and ideas into realities and move them forward.

The tree lot is no exception. With a goal of re-igniting the enthusiasm that has kept them going all these years, while not wearing out their man-and-woman-power, the leaders decided to be open only on weekends. Their willingness to change appears to be bringing results, and cautious optimism is growing. Perhaps most telling of all, in their first three weekends, they have sold all but 40 of their original shipment of 440 trees.

*If you would like to learn more about the children's charities that tree lot sales support, visit the lot next weekend before the trees are gone. The friendly people there will be happy to tell you about them, as well as to help you pick out a tree.
