Today - Valentine's Day - is the beginning of our Lenten journey. We embark on this journey as we remember Ash Wednesday.

The Apostle Paul writes to a ragtag group of Jesus-followers in Corinth (I lovingly call it ancient New Orleans due to its geography, mix of cultures, wild stories, etc.). He loved these individuals. He appreciated their quirks. He wrote them letters - often. Most scholars think that 1 and 2 Corinthians represent numerous letters that were merged. Additionally, there were like-

ly other letters to this group that are missing. After all, he started this church. He knew them well.

In his most famous words to this group, he explains love in a meaningful way. He shares in the thirteenth chapter that "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends...Faith, hope, and love endure, but the greatest of these is love."

My hope and prayer is that you can choose one of these descriptions of love to embody during Lent. For example, what if you were intentional about being kind? What if you didn't keep a record of wrongs? Therefore, it is fitting that Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday! May you embody love today, tomorrow, and beyond!


The First Step is the Most Difficult Rev. Dr. Jonathan B. Hall, Senior Pastor

However, if we change an assumption or two, the story has a profoundly different meaning for us here and now. The Lenten season can be a confusing Sunday School lesson. The dates vary widely, with Ash Wednesday coming as early as February 4 and Easter falling on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25. Youngsters born into many mainline Protestant churches in the 1940s and 1950s grew up thinking Ash Wednesday and the six weeks of Lent were more for Roman Catholics. Having Catholic playmates appear one day with gray smudges on their foreheads without having nearby adults reach for handkerchiefs to clean them off was more a curiosity than anything else. Hearing that a friend gave up vegetables for Lent seemed, to young minds, more like a treat than a sacrifice. Candy was a different story.

FCCNH Yearbooks dating from the 1950s and 1960s emphasize Palm Sunday processionals, Easter baptisms and multiple services. Ash Wednesday and Lent are not mentioned. As the Ecumenical movement broke down barriers, however, the importance of Ash Wednesday and Lent became more apparent. They represent the days when Jesus withdrew alone to the desert to fast, reflect on His life and strengthen spiritually before beginning His public ministry. We have been encouraged to use the time to reflect on and bring about change in our own lives.

Still a mystery, however, is exactly when we began offering the imposition of ashes. Newsletters from the 1990s mention Ash Wednesday gatherings for "meager meals," "hearty soup and bread," or "simple potlucks," followed by a service of "reflection and resolve" or "meditation and worship." Presently, 2000 is the earliest known mention of "the dispensing of ashes." They appear only intermittently in subsequent years.

The Ash Wednesday service on February 26, 2020 included both anointing and the imposition of ashes. Less than a month later, COVID caused the suspension of all in-person church services. In time for Ash Wednesday on February 17, 2021, however, the Worship Council had innovatively developed a drive-through protocol in line with city health regulations that enabled receiving both Communion and the dispensing of ashes while in our cars.

Since arriving at FCCNH, Pastor Jonathan has expanded on the concept of a drive-through imposition of ashes while also honoring the more traditional Simple Supper and worship service that includes receiving ashes more conventionally. Please see your February 7 newsletter for more information.






