


Thank you for being part of our amazing community! I need you. I need you to help me better walk with Jesus. We need each other to better follow Jesus so that all can "simply be themselves!"

"Us." "Them." "Those people." We hear this divisive language all of the time now. It sounded similar in Corinth. This is an extremely diverse town pinched on a four-and-a-half-mile wide isthmus that connects the Peloponnesian peninsula with the rest of Greece. In these tight quarters, Paul uses a term meaning brothers and sisters more than twice as often as any other letter. For Paul, "This is us." This is who we are today as the one family of God. David Rigsby announced his retirement recently and his last Sunday with us was to be September 15, 2024 but that's been extended by a week to September 22nd!

Of course, we thank God for David sharing his gifts at our church since January 1, 2006! We are grateful that he has given us six months to do the difficult work of finding a new Music Director. We have formed a search committee and their first step will be to put together a questionnaire for our congregation to help us discern the desired gifts of our next Music Director. After receiving this information, we will formalize the position's

details, share the job listing widely, and begin to receive applications.

David will be very busy until September 22. He will be retiring from his school at the end of the school year. David will be helping to lead *Godspell* at our church in August. Finally, he will be an integral part of our 100th Anniversary on September 8.

We had been located on the corner of Moorpark and Bakman before the move to our current campus in 1950. In the late 1940's plans had begun to be developed for a new church to be built on the corner of Colfax and Moorpark.

The "Little White Church" had taken on great meaning to the congregation that had built it, cared for it and used it as a place of worship. The building committee for the new church was attuned to these feelings and memories and incorporated a near replica of the "Little White Church" within the new structure at Moorpark and Colfax. This became our Memorial Chapel. Over the years the youth of the church used it for worship and study, as well as an adult congregation use as an early service location. Small weddings, memorial services, christenings have also taken place in it. The uses for the chapel were changing and there was the need to make adjustments to meet these new uses.

In 1977, the president of the congregation appointed a task force to recommend changes to increase the use and enhance the beauty of the chapel. The task force approached its assignment with an awareness of the history and need for preserving the basic elements of the chapel. The original redwood paneling was cleaned and hand rubbed with oil, the pews cleaned and the walls painted. Brass fixtures were also polished. A heavy communion table was removed and a lighter chancel table designed and built into the chancel wall.

To increase the chancel area, the modesty rail was removed (and later used to enclose the organ); the organ was moved to the rear; the first pew on each side was placed against the side walls. Two pews were removed in the rear for new organ space. These pews were cut down and placed in the corner of the chapel foyer.

Other changes included removing a pseudo-skylight, installing spotlights on a track with dimmers, lowering the chandelier, covering speaker openings with acoustical cloth, and installing a new organ.

The dream of a stained-glass window depicting our heritage was realized during this "makeover" of the chapel. Through the generosity of 6 members and their designated memorial gifts the stained-glass window wish came true on the back wall of the chancel.

The church obtained the services of The Judson Studios in creating our Heritage Window. It is an over 125-year-old, world renowned, family owned, stained glass company located here in Los Angeles. Even though Judson Studios has created countless liturgical windows it was Margaret Wilkes, a member of the task force, that noted the dove was shown as flying downward in the original depiction and not upwards. Releasing doves uplifts the eyes, symbolizing new beginnings, peace and love. It was quickly changed.



The Chalice bearing the "X" shaped cross of St. Andrew which is placed in the top of the Chapel Heritage Window, has come to be the symbol of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). The Chalice symbolizes the centrality of the Lord's Supper as well as the Cup of Christian self-giving for the world. The St. Andrew's Cross, national Cross of Scotland, focuses attention on the Scottish Presbyterian roots of the Christian Church. St. Andrew, too, has been identified with the laity and evangelism, prominent emphases of the Disciples over the years.

Many persons see in the symbol a more traditional cross tilted as if being carried or shouldered. The red color of the Chalice signifies vitality, spirit and sacrifice.

SYMBOLS IN THE HERITAGE WINDOW

(from the original dedication booklet)

The CHALICE AND BREAD depict the Lord's Supper at which the Son Himself is present. The cross of St. Andrew on the chalice symbolizes the whole community of believers who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior – and reminds Disciples of their Scottish roots.

The DOVE, the bird of a gentle nature, speaks of peace to a "People

of Peace." Christ sent forth the twelve with these words, "...be ye...harmless as doves."

The OPEN BOOK represents the written Word. Disciples are people of The Book; the word of God endures forever.

The FISHERMAN'S DORY WITH CROSS is the symbol of Christian Unity, The Oikoumene - Ecumenism. Ecumenism is the desire for unity among churches and believers in Jesus Christ. Disciples are a people with passion for unity.

The BASIN AND TOWEL signify the role of the servant which all are urged to emulate - even as Christ washed the feet of His apostles.

The CROSS is always a reminder of our Lord's saving work of redeeming mankind through His sacrifice for our sins, by which we receive forgiveness and salvation.

The TONGUES OF FLAME symbolize the outpouring of the gifts of the HOLY SPIRIT received in baptism and available to all believers.






