

Have you ever had an unexpected financial emergency or set-back and just didn't know where to turn? Back in 1973, John Avent, an active and generous member of our church, had a dear friend who lost his job and was struggling to keep his head above water. John wanted to help the family and then began to think how the church could help its members in times of temporary crisis. He gathered some other church leaders and formed a committee to explore ideas to create an emergency fund for temporary assistance for financial duress and counseling for our church members. Thus was born a new ministry, called The Good Sam Fund, appropriately named after the story Jesus told of the Good Samaritan.

They envisioned providing help like transportation, counseling, home repair, medical emergencies, and visitations as well as monetary aid. They began a campaign with board and minister approval to present the program to the congregation over the next few months to build the fund with their donations. It would be a revolving fund available for short term loans with little or no interest to be repaid as soon as recipients were able. All transactions would be completely confidential and approved by the trustees.

Over the years this fund helped many of us and in some cases became outright gifts when the recipients couldn't repay. Unfortunately, the fund eventually went too far into the "red" and was dormant for some time. But the good news is that a generous donor has resurrected the Good Sam Fund and brought it back into the "black" and it is providing that "Helping Hand" to members in need.

There are several ways YOU can help to keep this ministry that has such a rich history of helping people in need...going: outright donations, designated funds from Memorial Endowments, and pledges. And they are tax deductible.

As always, there are many ways to reach us with your prayer needs.




